Lance - good targets. Attracting back the select base is highly dependent on the RCL structure. Smaller RCL clubs are not serving the market.

- One of the reasons for submitting the LPT model to come back was to offer something new.
- Issues with WYS decision to deny insurance to member clubs with 100% WYS enrollment because a team competes in a US Club league or tournament.
 - The umbrella of USSF should be inclusive?
 - This might just come down to the first responsibility. Who is the priority insurance: should be the tournament host, then paid policy.
 - Players may not register next year because of restrictive (non-value add policies)
- There are many teams that have left from competitive.
- D4, and D1 are actively working on programs to grow rec soccer.

Update on the status of documents in play

- Registration document changes. Mostly on the dual rostering piece. This has been passed around numerous times and I expect is ready to vote on.
 - There is a US Youth rule, 206, that deals with this.
 - Maybe the wording is too specific?
- Registering to one team at a time, as stated today, is acceptable. No problem to solve here.

A referee policy out of Spokane.

- Purpose to make the SOC aware and seek input on putting parts of this into wider distribution or an op doc as well as discussion on jurisdiction of a referee association fining a US youth member that is not covered by the ref association membership or support area.
- The referee association has put rules in place in US Club associations in Spokane
- Bring this to April meeting to decide if this makes sense
